- Ensure a years worth of growth for a years schooling, based on student progress through clusters in the Literacy Continuum aspects of writing, reading and reading comprehension. Students will monitor, track and target cluster progression through goal setting.

#### Our initiatives include

- Embedd a whole school approach to writing to provide focused explicit teaching for students.
- Focus on using short cycle data to inform teaching, planning and learning for students by using regular and accurate data from formative and summative assessment to produce feedback and goals to improve learning.
- Providing opportunities for teaching staff to meet for planning, assessing and moderation.
- Embed the Before, After, After, End model of moderation.
- Continued provision and support for students through targeted intervention including additional speech language intervention for identified students.
- Engage and develop digital and design capability through interaction with IMPACT centre student technology programs.
